The leap by louise erdrich plot summary

Description: This story is about the narrator's mother Anna. Anna is a Trapezes artist and has experienced three leaps to tell her something about her life. The first leap came when Anna's first husband, Harold Avalon, was struck and killed by lightning. The narrator's siblings, who had not yet been born, had also died. The second leap was when Anna met the narrator's father. The last leap was when the narrator talked about flashbacks when her house burned down. The narrator was waiting in her room for someone to rescue her from the fire. Her mother, Anna, tried to enter the house, but was stopped by the people outside. Anna climbed a tree, jumped on the roof, entered the window and tried another way. Anna grabbed her daughter and both ran away from the burning house. The narrator thanked her mother for all the sacrifices she made for her. Point of view: This story is told from the narrator's point of view, but from the first person's point of view. Conflicts: Conflicts in this story are both internal and external. When Anna decides that her husband's death won't stop her from opening a new relationship, the conflict is inside. Conflicts are external based on the first and third leaps. The two leaps show examples of humans (Anna) and nature. Character Development: Throughout the story, Anna uses three leaps as a lesson in life. Despite the death of her first husband and children, she continued to start a new family. Anna put the past in her and didn't stop her from having a happy life. Theme: Don't let the past hold you from overcoming the bad situations you've experienced. If you don't have the courage, you won't be determined. We take risks for people who mean the world to us. Louise Erdrich's Wendy Segra English 2 Leap: The main idea of the story focuses on the story of a trappy narrator with the mother of an artist who lost her sight, along with the failure of balance and coordination in her life.
